A Higher Rock

Psalm 61 begins with this beautiful plea:

Hear my cry O God;

Attend to my prayer.

From the end of the earth I will cry to You,

When my heart is overwhelmed;

Lead me to the rock that is higher than I.

This is a prayer for help, deliverance, courage, and growth. The higher rock that the psalmist prays for is a place where we rise above our struggles, are strengthened, and are brought closer to God. It is also a place that challenges us to stretch and grow beyond our comfort zones to greater levels of faith, service, and devotion. It is very easy for us to become comfortable with who we are; with our level of faithfulness, knowledge, and involvement. Where we are is familiar, it is comfortable, it is easy. Sometimes we need to ask God to lead us to a rock that is higher than the one we presently occupy; one that is challenging, one that will cause us to be stretched and to grow. People of great faith are people who allow God to lead them to a higher rock. To stay with the known, familiar, and comfortable requires no faith. Higher rocks are where faith is. Higher rocks are where growth occurs. Higher rocks are where God desires to take us.

As individual Christians and as a church, we should desire higher rocks. We should desire to grow, to move forward, to serve God more acceptably each and every day. Often, we become very uncomfortable with the idea of growing and changing. We are afraid of the challenges of growth and of the danger of growing in the wrong direction. These are legitimate concerns and ones that we must be aware of, but we must also be aware of the dangers of sitting still, of not growing, of becoming complacent and lukewarm (Rev. 3:14-22). We must desire to grow and work toward that end. We must continually strive for greater faith, more knowledge, and better service. May God lead us to the rock that is higher than we are, and may we have hearts that are open to the challenges of growth.



Outreach—Pat Cowden

I want to continue with part of the lesson I teach in Personal Evangelism classes that I wrote last week in this space in the bulletin. This time I want to include the single greatest weight that keeps us from sharing our faith (Hebrews 12:1).

Fear

Self-doubt has suffocated the motivation of so many. "Can I do it? I don't know enough! They will slam the door in my face! I won't know how to answer their questions."

Fear paralyzes us to the point that we become "spiritu-plegic" meaning we are too scared to do anything outside of our comfort zone to share the gospel with others. We are paralyzed into inaction and feel like there is nothing we can do about it.

The only way you can overcome this kind of fear is when we challenge them head on. The first step is deciding if it is important enough to you to try to challenge your fear. Is it true that Jesus wants me to share my faith? Yes! Is it true that God is glorified when I do? Yes! Is it true that Jesus will not speak on my behalf to the Father

if I will not speak on His behalf (Matthew 10:32-33)? Yes!

These things being true, is my relationship with the Father and His Son important enough to me to risk relationships with others in order to have a chance, a shot, at sharing the gospel with them? I hope the answer to that is yes, because, if it is not, it is time to evaluate our understanding of what it means to be a "Christian"! Being a Christian is to be Christ-like. Did Jesus come (intended purpose) to seek and to save the lost (Luke 19:9-10)? Yes! To be Christ-like is to have His purpose and to emulate His actions. To be like Christ, we must seek the lost in order to save them. It is as simple as that.

Remember, I love you and want to go to heaven with you.


