# **Prayer: Our Last Resort**

I hope when you read the title of this article, that you thought to yourself, "That doesn't sound right." It shouldn't. We should not see prayer as a last resort. Instead, it should be the first thing that we do. But there is no doubt that sometimes we treat prayer as a backup plan.

As we have dealt with this pandemic, we have certainly been in prayer often for our members and loved ones who have contracted the disease. It's not that there is nothing else that we can do, because there is. But we recognize that ultimately, even when we have done our best, there is still a risk of serious illness and we are aware of our great need for God's blessings.

Now we face the uncertainty of a war in Ukraine that threatens the lives of people for no apparent reason, and we pray for God to intervene and cause peace to come. We pray because we see the human misery brought about by war, and we pray because we know some of the people in harms' way. In this case, at this moment, there is not a lot that we can do. But don't think of your prayers as insignificant in this great crisis.

The writer of the Proverbs told Israel that God is attentive to the request of His righteous people in Proverbs 15:29. Peter wrote much the same thing to the church. 1 Peter 3:12, "12 For the eyes of the LORD are on the righteous, And His ears are open to their prayers; But the face of the LORD is against those who do evil."

And James encourages us as Christians to pray for one another because God listens to our prayers. James 5:16-18, "<sup>16</sup>Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another so that you may be healed. The effective prayer of a righteous man can accomplish much. <sup>17</sup>Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the earth for three years and six months. <sup>18</sup>Then he prayed again, and the sky poured rain and the earth produced its fruit."

James' words remind us that the request of Elijah, a man like us, was listened to by God. As a result, don't minimize the impact of your own prayers to God. As Paul dealt with persecution, he told the church at Colossae to devote themselves to prayer for him and the preaching of the Gospel. (Colossians 4:2-4)

As we pray for one another, for the lost, and for our fractured world, recognize that prayer is not just our last resort, but instead our best course of action.
