Thankful for the small things...

As the holiday season rapidly approaches, we often take the time to reflect and thank God for the blessings that He has blessed us with throughout the year. Understandably, we can quickly recall those big milestone events with ease. However, sometimes we overlook and do not appreciate the small things that were necessary for those “big” things to occur in life. Sometimes we believe the small events may be insignificant but looking back, we can see they were the things that created the “big” events in life.

In Matthew 25, we read of the parable of the talents. We are familiar with this parable, but consider the response of the master in verse 23. *“Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.”* In society, people have come to realize the importance of small things. Employers, teachers, and coaches all realize that small, minor things are what lead to the execution of the “bigger” things in work, school, and games. When we show attention to those small things, bigger things become the intended progression because of that attention we gave the small things. Is this not the same with our Christian Walk? Small things are the foundational things that, when consistently applied, develop into bigger things on our Christian Walk.

Another scripture to consider is Matthew 17. Jesus uses the example of a small, insignificant mustard seed. Jesus says in verse 20, *“...if we have faith as a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, move from here to there and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you.”* Was this not one of the points that Jesus was making in this verse too? Focusing on even the smallest things in our Christian Walk can lead to major, life changing results. It could easily be determined that the smaller the thing or the more minor we think it is, the potentially bigger impact it could have on our life.
