What Is Your Talent?

This morning, following our worship, we will be having a “Ministry Expo.” The purpose of this event is to introduce the congregation to all of the different ministries and programs that Chase Park has in order to encourage members to find areas in which to be involved in the church’s work. This event will inevitably prompt the question, “What is your talent?” In answer to that question, there are probably more than a few of us who would respond with: “I don’t really have any talents.” We say this because we often understand a talent to be some specialized skill that is in great demand. Looking at our own lives, we may not see those skills and so, conclude that we have no real talents. While there are certainly some who possess those special skills that are uniquely valuable, we must not limit our understanding of talents to those rare gifts. The fact of the matter is that we all have talents that we can use in the service of God and to His glory. Some of those talents are very visible and are displayed very publicly while others are more discreet, working privately behind the scenes. But, regardless of the nature of the gifts, they are all important and vital to the effective working of the church (See Romans 12:3-8; Ephesians 4:11-16).

So, what is your talent? Maybe you are skillful in teaching a Bible class, leading in worship, or doing personal Bible studies - great! God blessed you with those gifts and needs you to use them in His service. Maybe your talent is simply making visitors feel welcome, being an encouragement to people around you, or showing compassion to those who are struggling. Guess what - those talents are just as important and needed in the Lord’s church! They are abilities that God blessed you with because He knew that the church needed you and that gift in order to be complete. Please do not underestimate or dismiss the importance and power of the abilities that God has given you. Be thankful for those talents and decide to use them for His glory in whatever way you have the opportunity. The Lord’s church, and Chase Park in particular, needs you and your talents in order to influence and impact this community for Christ. Together, we can do great things in the service of our Lord and to the glory of God.
