What Do You Want?

"What do you want?" Have you asked that question of anyone lately? If you are a parent with children still living at home, you probably have. There is no greater love than that! So, the next time that you take your petitions and requests before God, ask Him for the things that you want according to your understanding of your circumstances, but remember that God might have something much better prepared for you than you can even imagine. Accept His gifts with thanksgiving and praise, and submit to His will in meeting your needs.
