God Has Spoken

We live in a world that is ruled by subjectivism. By that I mean that every truth, every fact, and every justification is determined by our circumstances, opinions, or feelings. In this mindset, truth is only truth until it is no longer convenient and then it becomes someone else's wrong opinion. Oh, the confusion and error that has been caused by such a convoluted way of thinking! It is often a riddle that is only solved by conceding that we can each have our own truth based upon our own individual circumstances or beliefs, prompting us to make statements like, "That may be your truth, but it isn't mine."

To be fair, there are some situations in which that way of thinking is true. For example, what is the best color? There is no absolute right answer to that question. The right answer for any given situation might be determined by the circumstances or by one's own feelings or opinion, but one color is not intrinsically better than all the others. In that situation, we can each have our own truth.

That way of thinking, while it might work for colors, does not work for issues such as abortion, sexual morality, marriage, divorce, and remarriage, or salvation. For these issues, and many others, there is a definite right and wrong because God has spoken. Where God speaks, there is no room for "I think", "I feel", or "I believe". We are either with and for God, or we are against Him. God's truth may not always be easy, convenient, or popular, but that does not make it any less true. Even in the church there are some issues that are discretionary and subjective, but we must be very careful about creating our own truths in matters on which God has already spoken.

You have probably heard the saying, "God says it, I believe it, and that settles it." As well-meaning as that sentiment is, may I suggest that it is not correct because it suggests that a matter is not settled unless it is said by God and believed by me. The correct way of saying it is, "God says it and that settles it, so I believe it."
