North Carolina Campaign

Last week the Chase Park Youth Group took a trip to Charlotte, North Carolina and the Archdale Church of Christ to work alongside Barton Kizer and conduct a mission campaign. This trip consisted of three days (Wednesday – Friday) of service projects and door knocking in the morning followed by a VBS for the community in the evenings. On Sunday we had the opportunity to conduct the worship service for the congregation there as well as have an authentic, home-cooked meal with dishes from places like Honduras and El Salvador. This was a great week filled with the creation of new relationships as well as a great opportunity to grow spiritually!

One of the most interesting parts of this week was seeing the cross-cultural aspect of things. The area we were in had a very prominent Spanish culture which made things difficult in some aspects but also gave way to some really neat moments. For instance, in the Sunday PM service we had, we would sing songs we are very familiar with in Spanish and then in English immediately after. For the lesson, Gary Reaves spoke to us and flipped back and forth from Spanish to English throughout the entire thing. Although this made things confusing sometimes, it was one of the more memorable things about the trip to me. We even learned some new VBS songs in Spanish that get stuck in your head and are VERY difficult to get over.

The best part of the trip for me was the class I had the opportunity to assist in teaching. Prior to the trip, all of us attending signed up for the jobs we desired for the nightly VBS. These options consisted of games, crafts, class helpers, registration table, and teacher. I, along with Jacob Dozier, Wesley Dozier, and Jack Rosenblum had the privilege to teach the 5th – 8th grade class. A lot of these kids would be in what we consider to be “youth group age”. However, they don’t have a youth group. It was eye-opening to see how excited they all got when we played a game as simple as kickball or four-square. This was an experience these kids hadn’t gotten before and it was amazing to see how much fun they were having. Something that also stuck out to me was how attentive they were in class. At any given moment you could look up and see every single person in that room give whoever was teaching their undivided attention. It’s amazing to think back on how much these kids valued something that I believe we take for granted from time to time. Overall, this was a phenomenal experience and I look forward to hopefully being able to do it again sometime.
