Perspective on Evangelism for 2022

As we enter into the New Year, it is a great time to reflect on how we look at personal evangelism. Many people look at it negatively and want to just let people live their lives the way they want to. Ultimately, that is exactly what we want them to do, except, that we want them to learn to want to live their lives for Christ. Living faithfully to and for the Lord is so counter-intuitive to the culture that we live in making our responsibility to share the gospel (good news) with others even that much more difficult.

So, what do we do if we look at our lives honestly and see that we are coming up short in sharing our faith? I suggest starting small. Don't jump to the conclusion that being involved in the local evangelistic efforts of Chase Park means that you have to lead a study with someone right away. If every Christian would make an effort just to "till the soil" and look for opportunities, it would go a long way toward us winning our community for Christ.

When Paul says, "I became all things to all men" he was talking about making himself relatable to them. We need to be real; just be yourself and be intentional in your "walk of faith". Paul concludes the thought about being relatable by saying, "That I might save some." Even being inspired by the Holy Spirit did not make Paul think he could win everyone he came into contact with and neither will we. That is a great relief, to know that God does not expect you to convert people, he expects you to lead them to a decision point about Christ and His church. At that point, it is between them and God. I urge each of us to feel compelled to share our faith, look for opportunities, and let someone (like me) know if you have a good prospect to get to know and eventually study with.
