Your Cheering Section

Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, (Hebrews 12:1)

Have you seen pictures of the huge arenas that were part of the first century Roman world? (If you haven't, you can look up the Roman Colosseum and see a picture of an example). These structures were common in the ancient world. They held tens of thousands of people and were used for sporting events, gladiator fights, chariot races, and other spectator activities. Much like our modern stadiums, people would crowd into them to cheer on their favorite athletes and competitors.

When the Bible says that we are "surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses," it is painting a picture for us. The writer is envisioning one of those ancient theaters filled with people, but not just any people. This theater is filled with saints who have finished their race and have a home in heaven. Among the crowd, you can see Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Elijah, Daniel, and so many other great people that you read about in the Old Testament. This is the "cloud of witnesses" that is referred to in Hebrews 12:1. They are gathered together to encourage and cheer on to victory others who are still running the race, including YOU!

Can you see it? You are on the floor of the arena, running the Christian race, enduring the attacks of Satan, and doing your very best to be faithful to God. Now look up into the stands. In one section, you can see all of those great characters that you read about in the Old Testament. In another section, there are the apostles and many early Christians. In the next section, you see Christians from throughout the centuries who endured great persecution but remained faithful to God. And then you get to the next section, and you see the familiar people that you know from your church and other places where you have Christian friends. They are all cheering for you! From Abraham, Moses, David, Elijah, Peter, Paul, and John to your Christian friends today—they are all rooting for you and encouraging you to keep going and to win the race. Isn't that amazing? That is the picture that God paints for you through the words of Hebrews 12:1.
