## July Evangelism Update



So, are you an evangelist?

A former tax collector and a few fishermen—eleven regular guys. These first-century Christians were given a seemingly impossible task: Go evangelize the world.

And the command now comes to us. We must evangelize the world. We must not allow our friends and loved ones, or strangers we come in contact with, die without having heard the gospel. I often tell people, in classes about evangelism, that we need to give as many people as possible the opportunity to say “no” to the gospel. We want them to say “yes” and pray that they do. But, the ultimate human role in evangelism is to take the message to the world, what they do with it is between them and God.

If you are not excited or interested in being an ambassador for God, you are in good company. Moses didn’t want to do it either. He couldn’t imagine himself being God’s spokesman to Pharaoh. What Moses needed to understand was that God wasn’t asking Moses to go back to save the children of Israel. He was commanding him to go.

Similarly, we need to understand that the Lord didn’t just ask that we help Him in saving others, He commands it. If you’ve been saved from your sins, it is expected that you will help the Savior find others to save. It is expected that you and I be evangelists. Every Christian should be involved, in some way, in spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ through evangelism.

The best thing you can ever do is to serve others by being evangelistic. By being a messenger for Christ, you will receive the ultimate reward, the joy of knowing that you were able to help Jesus find a lost soul.

Good deeds are your first tool of evangelism. They open the door. They let someone know that you care. Master the example of Christ, and you’ll be well on your way to being a first-rate evangelist. (Acts 10:38)
