Exposure Youth Camp Review

Two weeks ago our CPYG attended Exposure Youth Camp at the Von Braun Center in Huntsville. The dates for Exposure Youth Camp are December 27-30. During EYC our teens attend nightly worship services, Spiritual Challenge Sessions, morning devotionals, singings, participate in teams, and more. This year EYC broke a record with 3,008 people registered and over 125 congregations attending.

Our theme for 2023 was "Into Reality." The first full day of EYC, students heard lessons and attended classes focusing on the realities of this world (i.e. social media, racism, gender identity, role confusion, truth confusion). On the second day students heard lessons and attended classes focusing on how Christians can minister to those facing the world's realities and find absolute truth in God's word. Throughout the week there were 13 baptisms and over 70 responses to the gospel of Christ. Yet there were many more who benefitted from such an uplifting and challenging week in God's word.

I'm grateful to our CPYG, as 38 attended EYC. Our CPYG students are some of the best teens. I've always been impressed at their desire to learn, to develop friendships, and their character. In addition, a BIG THANK YOU goes to our chaperones who are a great help to me and our teens.
