Show Them You Care

Someone has wisely observed that "people will not care how much you know until they know how much you care." This is a principle that our Lord certainly understood as He stated that one of the greatest commands, second only to the command to love God with all of our heart, soul, and mind, is to love our neighbors as ourselves (Matt. 22:34-40). In His own ministry, Jesus was often seen showing compassion on the sick and suffering, on the hungry crowds that had come to hear him teach, or even on sinners in need of mercy. He had come to show God to the world (John 14:7-11), and He did so, at least in part, through His love and compassion.

As we strive to take the saving message of the gospel into our community, neighborhoods, workplaces, and schools, we must understand that teaching others involves more than simply making them aware of sin and God's plan for redemption; it involves showing them the love of Christ and letting them know that we care for them. While we, like the apostle Paul, must be willing to declare to our friends and neighbors "the whole counsel of God" (Acts 20:27), we must also keep in mind that our actions—a kind word, a good deed, a helping hand, or a selfless act of service—can have a profound effect on people's lives and on their receptiveness to the gospel. Our efforts to reach out to others will be made even more effective if the people that we are trying to reach know, without a doubt, that Christ, and we, love them. Think of it as nourishing the soil of their hearts with kindness and love in order to prepare them to receive the seed of the word of God.

Here's a challenge for you. Make a conscious effort this week to look for opportunities to make a difference in the lives of others. Strive to be more thoughtful, more compassionate, and more helpful. Make a point to smile more, to give more hugs and pats on the back. Be more positive and encouraging. Try to live your life this week so that, when others see your faith, your joy, and your enthusiasm, they think to themselves, "I want to have what they have." See if these small changes to your everyday life can make a difference; both in your attitude and in the attitudes of those around you. It might just be a change that you decide to make permanent.
