Is There No God?

In Stephen Hawking's final book "Brief Answers to Big Questions," published Tuesday (Oct. 16) by Bantam Books, the professor begins a series of 10 intergalactic essays by addressing life's oldest and most religiously fraught question of all: Is there a God?

"I think the universe was spontaneously created out of nothing, according to the laws of science," Hawking, who died in March, wrote. "If you accept, as I do, that the laws of nature are fixed, then it doesn't take long to ask: What role is there for God?"

When I read these words, I was immediately reminded of the apostle Paul's letter to the Romans. In the first chapter, beginning at verse 18, he addresses these kinds of beliefs, which were common even in the first century. In verses 18-23, he states:

¹⁸ For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, ¹⁹ because what may be known of God is manifest in them, for God has shown it to them. ²⁰ For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse, ²¹ because, although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, but became fulle in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened. ²² Professing to be wise, they became fools, ²³ and changed the glory of the incorruptible God into an image made like corruptible man—and birds and four-footed animals and creeping things. ⁸

Hawkins did go on to also state in his book: "If you like, you can say the laws are the work of God, but that is more a definition of God than a proof of his existence, with the universe running on a scientifically guided autopilot, the only role for an all-powerful deity might be setting the initial conditions of the universe so that those laws could take shape — a divine creator who caused the Big Bang to bang, then stepped back to behold His work...We have this one life to appreciate the grand design of the universe," Hawking concludes the first chapter of his final book, "and for that I am extremely grateful."

Even atheists like Hawkins had to realize that there was more to our world and existence than our own humanist beliefs would allow, but he could not admit to the existence of our omnipotent God, who created the universe. Certainly, he now knows better, as he died in March 2018.

Paul concluded the section in Romans with a summary in verse 24, "therefore God also gave them up to undeanness, in the lusts of their hearts, to dishonor their bodies among themselves,"
