Too Busy For God?

Have you ever felt like you were too busy for God? As this new school year begins, and as our schedules and calendars begin to fill with appointments and obligations, may we never forget that our first and most important commitment is always to God, and may that commitment be seen in the way that we spend our time and in the choices that we make.


