Believing is Not Seeing.... (Matthew 8:5-13)

In Matthew 8:5-13, we read of a centurion's great faith in the Lord. The centurion had asked Jesus to heal his paralyzed servant. Throughout the Bible, Jesus was constantly asked to perform a miracle of healing for those who were sick, lame, blind, etc. There were mass crowds who flocked to see or just catch of glimpse of Jesus performing a miracle.
