What's Your "One Thing"?

Listen to the words of Paul in Philippians 3:12-14:

Not that I have already attained, or am already perfected; but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me. Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

As Paul considers the purpose and goals of his life in this world, he says, "one thing I do..." Certainly, Paul did not mean by that statement that he had completely abandoned every other pursuit or activity in life. For example, we know that, at times, Paul worked as a tentmaker to provide for his physical needs. He also undoubtedly had friendships and interests that were of a physical nature and not directly related to his work as an evangelist. But none of those things were the central focus of Paul's life. None of them were the object of his faith or the source of his hope. Only Christ occupied that spot in Paul's mind, heart, and life. His "one thing" was to pursue a relationship with God through Jesus Christ. Everything else paled in comparison.

So what's your "one thing"? This world is filled with things, activities, and responsibilities that constantly compete for our time, attention, and focus. Jobs, social activities, personal fulfillment, physical obligations and responsibilities, and the list goes on and on. In that world, it can be easy to put too much of ourselves into endeavors and interests that have nothing to do with our spiritual wellbeing and that maybe even work against our spiritual success. We often spread ourselves too thin by trying to juggle all of those things, along with our spiritual lives, at the same time. It can be overwhelming, and our relationship with Christ often gets lost in the shuffle.

So, what's the solution? God does not ask us to completely abandon every other aspect of life. Instead, he calls us to put Him at the center of our lives as the "one thing" that we trust in completely and live for above all else so that every facet of our lives is focused on and reflects Him. As we do that, the other endeavors of life continue on but fade in priority as they give way to the one thing that is, by far, the most important thing—our relationship with God through Christ. May we always remember what matters most and constantly keep Him as our "one thing".
