September 2024 Chase Park Evangelism Update



Last week, I announced that we were going to start a new class/training for people who want to improve their outreach abilities and to those who wish to participate in Chase Park mission trips. We began that class this past Wednesday night (it is not too late to be in the class this quarter if you are interested). I would like to give more details about the class in this article.

The class is a one quarter class that will be repeated twice in 2024 and 2025 for a total of three quarters. The first one will go through November, the second one through March and these will be intended for the adult members of our congregation. From April through May 2025, we will be having a quarter that will involve the teens and any other adults who were not able to make it to the first two quarters or for new members of Chase Park who would like to attend.

The intent is to improve our evangelistic outreach efforts locally, stateside, and worldwide. Our initial goal is to reach out to people we are currently in contact with (family, friends, neighbors, coworkers) or these we randomly meet. The final goal is to bring these people to a decision point about Christ and to increase their probability of saying "Yes" to Him through obedience to the gospel.

One of my observations over the last 30 or so years is the need for proper training in this type of outreach. Not just locally, but also when we go away from home, either stateside or overseas. There are a lot of differences in cultures and world views that must be taken into consideration when we decide to go to another location. Although the gospel does not change, our interaction with people must adapt to the specific location we are evangelizing if we are going to be successful in planting the seed of God's Word.

We plan on having fun in this class, but also take it seriously because the number one responsibility we have as Christians is to make disciples (Matthew 28:19; Luke 19:10). I am passionate about "doing no harm" when we reach out and want to be intentional about maximizing our potential in the Lord's Kingdom. My Prayer is that you share my passion and want to be involved and give your input on how we can glorify God in our combined efforts.

We plan on making an announcement soon about where we are considering going on our first trip in the Summer of 2025.
