What Do You Do?

What do you do when everything in your life seems to be falling apart? Maybe it's the loss of a job, some devastating family issue, an unexpected health crisis, or any one of a hundred other things that can come into our lives unexpectedly and without warning and completely disrupt the order and predictability that we hope for in our lives. Our reaction to such situations is often one that is just that—reactionary. We panic and act rashly or, on the other end of the spectrum, ignore the problem and do nothing. We might lash out at others, looking for someone to blame, or alienate ourselves from everyone, internalizing all of the fear and hurt that we are experiencing. We often blame God, become bitter toward Him, and question why He has failed to bless or protect us. None of these reactions are helpful or productive and often only exacerbate the problem, but, in those moments of weakness and stress, our humanity seems to find a way to take over.

It is the attitude toward God that is expressed earlier that I would like to focus on for a moment. I cannot pretend to understand the ways of God—why He chooses to allow the trials that He does and how He chooses to care for us during those trials. We often try to rationalize things and explain why God does the things He does. In reality, as much as we would like to understand those things, we are not God and are not capable of comprehending the things of God (Isaiah 55:8-9). I also don't pretend to have all the answers as to why things happen or how we are to react to the severe trials that life often holds. Every person and situation is unique and must be dealt with in its own way. Having said that, here are a few suggestions that you might find helpful when dealing with difficult trials:

- 1. **Focus on the positive**. Trust me, I know that this is much easier said than done, but instead of asking why God has allowed or caused the suffering, be thankful to God for His care and blessings even in spite of the suffering. Instead of blaming God for the trial, thank Him for His help.
- 2. Focus on the future. Have you ever noticed that when we are facing trials we are often consumed with what "has happened?" Instead, try to focus your view on the blessings (often unknown) that God will surely grant if we trust Him and hold tightly to Him (Romans 8:28).
- **3.** Focus on others. Instead of looking for someone to blame or pulling ourselves away from everyone, allow others to help and comfort you and look for ways to bless others even in the midst of your suffering. You may end up being the one to be blessed.

I truly appreciate men like Stephen Rogers who have dedicated their lives to reaching the lost and helping others learn how to do so as well. The seminar we had on Church Leadership and Personal Evangelism was a shot in the arm that we needed at Chase Park. We have 47 people who came to either one or more of the three sessions. Three of those that came were from the Northwest congregation.


