

The Master of the Storm

Some of my favorite texts among those chronicling the life of Jesus are those that take place on or around the Sea of Galilee. The lessons that He teaches there are powerful and full of meaning, but the sea itself, as the backdrop of those lessons, adds much to their effectiveness. There is a sense, I believe, in which the Sea of Galilee stands as a metaphor for our lives. It is a beautiful place that provides nourishment, fulfillment, and comfort to those who embrace it; but it can also be a tumultuous and unpredictable place that can wreak havoc on the senses and fill the heart with fear. It is a place that, on fair days, can offer peace and satisfaction, but with the constant understanding that a violent storm may unexpectedly blow in at any moment. Such is life in this world.

It is no surprise, then, that so many of Jesus' experiences on the sea with His disciples involve storms—storms that rob them of their peace and fill them with panic instead. And it is no surprise that Jesus is revealed, on each occasion, as the Master of the sea and the storm, restoring the calm in both the sea and in the hearts of men. That these scenes are highlighted in the gospel accounts is no coincidence. They are included, not only to give us insight into Jesus's relationship with His disciples, but to teach and remind us that He is still the Master of the storm.

Much like the Sea of Galilee, our lives can often be beautifully calm and comfortable, offering joy, provision, and fulfillment. But also like that sea, our lives are subject to sudden and powerfully destructive storms that can appear without warning or explanation. What do we do when we face those storms of life? How do we react to them? Do we cry out to Jesus in fear exclaiming, "Do You not care that we are perishing?" Or do we boldly call on Jesus to have us defy the storm and walk on water, only to have our faith overwhelmed by fear as the storm surrounds us? These are very human reactions that we see in the examples of the Apostles. We also see, in these cases, that Jesus would ask us, "Why are you so afraid?" as He encourages us to have faith in Him to care for us through the storm and see us safely to the other side. Storms of life will surely come, but as long as we are in the presence of the Master of the storm, we have nothing to fear!
