Here I Raise My Ebenezer

In the song, "Oh Thou Fount of Every Blessing", the author, Robert Robinson, has the phrase, "Here I raise my Ebenezer." Have you ever wondered what that means? The phrase refers to a memorial built by the Israelites after they had been victorious over the Philistines. 1 Samuel 7:12, "Then Samuel took a stone and set it between Mizpah and Shen, and named it Ebenezer, saying, 'Thus far the LORD has helped us.'"

You see, Israel had been harassed by the Philistines for some time and in 1 Samuel 4, they decided to go out to war against them. Rather than seek God's guidance, they foolishly decided that they could get God to fight for them by bringing the Ark of the Covenant into battle with them. (Note to self: I can't make God do what I want Him to do. Instead, I need to do what He wants me to do.) The battle was a disaster, and the Ark was taken by the Philistines. God punished the Philistines for taking the Ark, so they sent it back to Israel.

In chapter 7, Samuel encouraged the people to end their idolatry and come back to the Lord with their whole heart. He called all of Israel to Mizpah where he would pray for the nation to be restored to God. When the Philistines saw that Israel had gathered, they came out in battle against them.

Israel was afraid of what was about to happen to them, but this time Israel's approach to God was different. They didn't try to force His hand. Instead, they asked Samuel to pray for them that God might save them.

1 Samuel 7:10-12, "¹⁰Now Samuel was offering up the burnt offering, and the Philistines drew near to battle against Israel. But the LORD thundered with a great thunder on that day against the Philistines and confused them, so that they were routed before Israel. ¹¹The men of Israel went out of Mizpah and pursued the Philistines, and struck them down as far as below Beth-car. ¹²Then Samuel took a stone and set it between Mizpah and Shen, and named it Ebenezer, saying, 'Thus far the LORD has helped us.'"

As we have lived through a very difficult year and a half, and we are now finally beginning to get back to something close to normal, we must not forget to stop and take note that God has brought us this far. So, take the time to bow in prayer and thank the Lord for being our help seeing us through this pandemic. "Hither by Thy help I've come; And I hope by Thy good pleasure Safely to arrive at home."
