Bridging the Gap

We have introduced our theme for 2019 and discussed some of the ways that it will be applied to our faith and work, but as we begin this journey together, let me encourage us all to take a moment to make a very personal application of this concept to our individual lives. To begin this process, ask yourself the question: are there gaps in my spiritual life that need to be bridged? A weakness in my faith? A lack of devotion in my daily walk? A daily struggle that I cannot seem to overcome? These, and many other issues can easily cause problems in our spiritual lives and keep us from being as close to God as we want or need to be.

For many of us, the difficulty is not in identifying the gaps in our spiritual lives, but in figuring out how to close them. What can we do to strengthen our faith, increase our devotion, or fortify a weak point in our daily lives? It is a struggle that many have faced over and over again, often with less than desired results. The fact of the matter is that there is no easy fix or magical solution to the problem of spiritual gaps. If a person wants to move closer to God in his life and close the spiritual gaps that exist, there must be a sincere desire, a willing heart, and a diligent effort. Consider these suggestions:

- Identify the gaps. What are the weaknesses and shortcomings that exist in your spiritual life? Write them down so that you can be reminded of them from time to time.
- **Pray about them.** Ask repeatedly for wisdom, strength, patience, and for God's help in improving those aspects of your spiritual life.
- Formulate a plan. Decide what steps you want to take to grow in your spiritual life—daily Bible study, more frequent prayer, removal of undue influences, more involvement with the church, etc.
- **Don't give up.** Continue to work diligently on those areas of improvement. If you find yourself slipping in motivation, go back to that written list of gaps in order to renew your determination, and never stop praying about them.



Outreach—Pat Cowden

I thought it might be wise to fill in some of the blanks for our new "Open Home Ministry" that will, Lord willing, kick off this coming Saturday, January 12th. There was not nearly enough time to make the program clear, so I will try to clear up some of the details here, and perhaps in future articles.

For the last year, we have had classes in most of the adult classes pertaining to improving our local outreach. The summary of those classes is this: God wants us to win souls; so, how can we as individuals and as a congregation please God in these efforts? We must be intentional and focused; we must change our thinking to include prioritizing the effort to reach souls for Christ. This OHM program is intended to give us the avenue to do just that.

The foundation of this program is reaching out and generating or encouraging interest in spiritual matters with potential prospects we come in contact with on a regular basis. Twice per year, each OHM team will meet at my home after each of us have "tilled the soil" on our prospects. At the appropriate time, these prospects will be invited to come to a get together with a spiritual flavor away from the church building. Each meeting will include a period of prayer and singing as well as a short devotional message followed by a meal. Those we invite need to be informed that we will be spending some time devoted to God so that they are not surprised when that happens (remember, these are folks we are trying to encourage to consider spiritual matters). Everyone is encouraged to come and to bring your whole immediate family.

Evangelism challenge:

We have a full year's schedule of these meetings; however, if you or someone you know has spiritual interest or questions, we must not wait until your scheduled meeting. We need to take proper advantage of each opportunity when they come up. I would love to help you with those and am available anytime.

Remember, I love you in the Lord and want to go to heaven with you.


