Too Busy for God?

We live in a very busy world. Obligations, appointments, responsibilities, and schedules fill up our days and our lives at a dizzying pace as we try to keep up with the world around us. But even while we bemoan our busyness and complain about our lack of time, we might also find, on closer inspection, that our overfilled calendars are actually a source of pride that we unwittingly pursue. We delight in boasting to others about how busy we are, feigning frustration and reveling in our own exhaustion. Unfortunately, in the mad dash of life, it is often the most important things that get pushed to the side and neglected—family, health, and, most of all, God.

“I’m just too busy for God.” Most of us would probably never dare to make a statement like this, but many times, our lives may say it for us. Like Martha in Luke 10, we can become distracted by the tasks at hand and lose sight of the one thing that is needed. Prayer, Bible study, and worship are often considered less pressing than the many other activities and obligations of life and are relegated to the category of “if I have time.”

So, what is the solution to this dilemma that so many of us face? While there may be many answers that can be offered to this question, there is a concept that is especially prevalent in the Old Testament that I believe could be very valuable to getting a handle on this problem. That concept is “be still.” Possibly the most well-known example of this is found in Psalm 46:10— *“Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!”* To “be still” is to calm and quiet the body, mind, and spirit, so that proper attention and care can be given to the most important things. Quiet, contemplative meditation on God’s word; devoted, uninterrupted time in prayer; heartfelt, undistracted worship—these are some of the things that exemplify being still. “But,” we say, “I just don’t have time for those things. I’m too busy.” The truth of the matter is that we always find time for the things that are important to us. May we never be too busy for God.
