Chase Park Evangelism Update August 11, 2024 “Finishing Strong”

Sister Martha Lawson passed away last month, and will be missed by a lot of people, including me. I met her a few years back while we were in a hospital waiting room. I did not really see much of her for the next almost six years, but then I got a call from her. She wanted to know if I would come to her house to hold a bible study with her caregiver, Caroline Young. She was already hosting a ladies bible study on Tuesday morning, so we had to figure out a time and day that would work for her. We decided on Tuesday afternoons at one and it was a standing date. Most of the time our studies included the three of us, but we also had a study with Michelle, Caroline’s best friend, and Brandon, the young man who did her pest control.

When Maria and I were making final preparations for our Evangelistic campaign to Kailua, Hawaii with Ron and Zita McCall, as well as the Ormond’s from Virginia, I gave Miss Martha and Caroline two assignments to start while I was on the mission trip. When I returned, at our first study, I asked them if they had started on Lance Mosher’s book, *Transformed*. Caroline started laughing and said, we finished that awhile back. They had read it out loud to each other. I was impressed and pleased that they had taken the time and had the interest to read the whole book and discuss it in length. So, I asked them if they had started on the second assignment which was to begin the lessons in the New Convert Book, *The Beginning of Our Confidence*, by Bro. David Pharr. They said yes, they had started it as well. So, I asked what lesson they were on. Caroline said they had finished lesson 22. I was amazed and overjoyed, because that is when I knew that Caroline was serious about Bible study.

Shortly after our return, she was baptized, and then the work started on Caroline’s husband, John. He came to the New Convert dinner that we had in March and everyone made him feel so welcome. Then he started attending services, and everyone made him feel welcome, and eventually he asked me if we could study the Bible together (right before I was going to ask him for a study). After about a month or so, John was also baptized into Christ.

Why retell these stories? Because it all started with Miss Martha sharing her faith with someone she cared about. And... it was after she had recently turned 90 years old. I am so glad I got to meet her and I am so glad she spent the last seven months of her life helping Caroline and John and perhaps others as well come to Christ. She is a great example to imitate (1 Corinthians 11:1), because she was imitating Christ. And to our senior members, she is a great example of how to finish life strong. I want to be more like Miss Martha, and wish I could have known and worked with her longer.
