A Political Assassination

Assassinations, and their attempts, have existed throughout mankind's existence on this Earth. There have been too many in our nation during our lifetimes. So often these attempts are exercised on political figures. (Perhaps this is a commentary on our inability to govern ourselves and how greatly we need God in our lives directing us.) America has recently experienced another such attack on one of our leaders. Most individuals are able to recall where they were when they heard about a particular assassination. How well are you able to recall where you stood in relation to a particular "assassination"?

Consider this perspective – the Jewish council was unwilling to accept the reality of the Messiah having come into this world. He wasn't delivering the "kind" of nation they had imagined He would establish. He didn't fit into their plans. Instead, they perceived Him as being a threat to their positions of power within the nation. As a result, they plotted and planned on how to "get Him out of the picture." As we know, their efforts resulted in lies and deception, with the Messiah being arrested, scourged and crucified. The one whom the people had sought and honored days before was now their enemy. The people had been led to believe that which was not true. The result was that the Messiah had been killed.

From one perspective this brief account of the "assassination" appears to be true. Certain aspects indeed fit with truth. However, it is not complete. The leaders of the council and the people were involved in the killing of Jesus, but this was far from being just a violent assassination. Instead, the death of the Messiah was a passionate sacrifice. The Messiah, our Savior, had offered Himself as the redeeming sacrificial lamb to provide a way for His children to come home to God. They had not taken His life from Him (John 10:15-18). He had given His life in sacrifice for us.

Now for the question: Where were you at the time of Christ's death? Oh, I know we weren't there, but relative to each of us, Christ died for us to have a way of escape from the bondage of sin (John 3:16-17). "We", our sins, put Him on that cross and brought about His death. I suppose a better question might be, where are you "now" in respect to the Messiah's death?
