Does It Really Matter?

"Does it really matter whether I attend all the services of the church? After all, Sunday (morning worship) is the only time that we are commanded to meet. Right? For so many Christians, this is the attitude and thought process concerning Bible studies and other meeting times of the church. But is this a valid argument? Are the other services (besides Sunday morning worship) really optional, and therefore unimportant?

The simple answer to the original question is YES, it really does matter whether we faithfully attend the services of the church. First of all, consider what the bible says about when we should worship. Certainly, the church did meet on the first day of the week (Acts 20:7). This was the designated time to commemorate the Lord's death with the Lord's Supper that they worshipped together. But this was certainly not the only time that they gathered together. Both scripture (e.g. Acts 2:46) and historical accounts of the church tell us that early Christians met together for worship and fellowship very often. If we are truly to follow their example, we should desire to meet together whenever we have the opportunity.

Secondly, consider the benefits of gathering with the church. The services of the church provide opportunities for us, as Christians to worship God and become more knowledgeable concerning God's Word, all while encouraging other Christians and being encouraged in our own lives. Any faithful Christian ought to have a great desire to do all of these things. Gaining maturity and growth as a child of God should be a primary concern for us, and taking advantage of opportunities to do those things should be a natural desire.

Finally, consider what is probably the greatest problem with the attitude described above—the condition of the heart. You see, if I understand what is taking place when the church meets (worship, Bible study, fellowship, etc.) and I regularly choose not to be a part of those things, I am saying to myself, my family, my fellow-Christians, and to God that I do not really want to worship God or grow as a Christian. I am saying that those things are not important to me and I would rather be doing other things. I am saying that I will only worship when I am required to. Remember the words of Jesus as He quoted from Isaiah the prophet in Matthew 15:8, "These people draw near to Me with their mouths and honor me with their lips, but their heart is far from me." Surely we do not want to have that kind of attitude as Christians.

May we all be fully committed to faithful Christian lives and to serving God acceptably each day.

"Talofa" again from Pago Pago, American Samoa. The church here sends their love and appreciation for allowing Maria and I to come teach them from God's Word. We finished our gospel meeting last night and the experience was incredible. There was very good participation from the community and from two other congregations on island. Maria had some wonderful classes with the ladies, which I heard were much needed. They were very appreciative of her Bible knowledge and ability to make things understandable and show how they apply to everyday life. If you have been to any of her classes, I am sure you would agree.

The men of the congregation were equally appreciative of the 11 lessons shared during the 8-day meeting. The heat and humidity was an obstacle, but we managed to get through that. The climate is very similar to what we experienced in Saipan, but it has been 11 years since we were in the tropics in the summer. (American Samoa is on the other side of the equator.)

As expected, the Samoan people were welcoming and kind. We love the hearts of most of the people we have met in our travels to the Pacific and these were no exception. They were very generous of their meager means, there is not much

work here except a tuna canning factory. There were three major storms that came through in the two weeks before we came "on-island". That meant no work, which means no pay. It also meant seven days per week production until they made up for lost time. Considering they were working very hard labor for very long hours for several days in a row, I was extremely pleased with their attendance and interest in spiritual matters.

Please pray for open hearts and free course for the gospel here. And don't forget, there are folks we are studying and working with in Huntsville that need our prayers as well. Please encourage our visitors, and let your lights shine brightly this week and every week.

(Lord willing, when you are reading this, we should be home, and you should see us in "our seats.")

Remember, I love you and want to go to heaven with you.
