

Last week I mentioned the biblical truth that it is not hard to find or understand what the Bible says about who will go to heaven. We looked at Matthew 7:21 where Jesus said, "Not everyone who says to Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven." It is really not any more complicated than that.

As people who are concerned about where people will spend eternity, you and I want to help people come to a decision about whether they want to accept what the bible says and examine the churches around them to see if they are doing "the will of the Father".
