How Did He Do It?

This week in our Chase Park Daily Bible Readings we are reading about Jesus' final days upon the Earth. Throughout this week we will read about the last supper Jesus had with His apostles, His prayer in Gethsemane, His betrayal, arrest, trials, the crucifixion, death and resurrection. There are so many events packed into this one week of Bible readings that are essential for our spiritual knowledge and development.

Each time you begin your scheduled readings I want you to start by asking the question, "How did He do it?". When you read and discover the magnitude of Jesus' journey to the cross I'm amazed by His determination. Throughout this week you will encounter challenges that Jesus faced in His journey to the cross. Here are a few of the challenges you will read about...

- Jesus would wash the feet and share a meal with His own betrayer.
- Jesus' apostles would all flee from Him the very night of His arrest.
- Peter would deny Jesus 3 times before His crucifixion.
- Jesus would ask the Father to forgive the mob for they didn't know what they were doing.
- Jesus would endure the pains of the cross and give His life for the world.

How did He do it? Jesus would give all that He had physically, mentally and emotionally for humanity. Romans 5 gives us a great insight as to how and why Christ accomplished His journey to the cross. God saw the weakness and separation of mankind and He desired to mend the relationship. Although sin had driven a wedge between God and man, God still desired to be with His creation. Therefore, it was through His son, who shared the same desire, to reconcile humanity back to Him. It had to be a perfect sacrifice and it required the Lamb of God. This is how He did it. As you read this week continue to ask the question and remember great texts such as Romans 5.
