## In the Beginning, God Created...

- **Opportunities.** God, through His wisdom and power, gives us opportunities each day to learn, grow, serve, forgive, influence, and do good (Gal. 6:10).
- **Renewal.** God, through Christ, is able to create, in us, renewal—renewal from sin, discouragement, complacency, and a troubled spirit (Isaiah 40:31).

Let's thank and give praise to God today for all that He has created and all that He continues to create in our lives!




