

# In Everything Give Thanks

"In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thessalonians 5:18) This time of year we are reminded of the importance of giving thanks to God for our many blessings, and none of us have any problem finding plenty of reasons to give Him thanks. We are all certainly blessed far beyond what we deserve, and yet, the command, "in everything give thanks" can still be a huge challenge. This is true because we all face circumstances in life from time to time that we don't automatically see as worthy of giving thanks for. Sickness, injuries, financial struggles, relationship issues, or simply unpleasant situations can often cause us to feel anything but thankful. Does God really expect us to give thanks in those situations, and if so, how do we find it within ourselves to do so?

The key to finding thankfulness in the midst of trials is to be able to look beyond the trial to see the blessing. Doing so doesn't make the trial any less difficult but it does help us to focus on God instead of the struggle. Paul provides a great pattern for this as he deals with his "thorn in the flesh" in 2 Corinthians 12:7-10. Paul's source of suffering was not removed and continued to be a source of trials in his life, but the revelation that those trials allowed the strength of God to be made complete in Paul's life changed his mindset. You see, it may be that our struggles, as unpleasant as they are, may be opening doors for God's providential care and help to bring blessings into our lives. It may be that our trials help to remind us of our constant need for God and of His continual presence in our lives. The challenges we face may serve to strengthen our faith and deepen our relationship with God. While the trials themselves may not feel thanksgiving worthy, the effect that those difficulties have on our spiritual lives may be well worth our giving of thanks.

As you pause to give thanks to God in your daily life, don't forget to consider the blessings that are yours even as a result of the trials that you face. God is good, not only in the pleasant and prosperous times of our lives, but also in the difficult and dark days that we must face. The giver of every good gift is also our constant companion through the trials and tribulations of life. So, "in everything give thanks."
